When my family was just starting out and I was struggling to find employment, we couldn't meet our basic life needs such a food. Once I was able to find stable employment, I was able to provide for my family and move out of lower end of the economic scale. 2. Provide affordable housing. If your on social assistance, which I was for a brief time many years ago, your resources for shelter are limited. Providing safe affordable housing is key to starting to create a base by which you can then seek employment.3. Access to resources. If you're broke, you most likely don't have a computer or vehicle to seek employment or go to interviews. 6. London has an affordable housing reserve fund. The fund was developed to help create additional affordable housing units. How should the affordable housing reserve fund be used?

I'm interested in the way the Affordable Housing for Ontario Program (IAH) program sets out spending on affordable housing. Leveraging our current inventory of vacant and unused second and third story floor space above street level commercial businesses. This type of planning permits us to rehabilitate and convert previously uninhabitable properties and stay congruent with the idea of building inward. Unfortunately we can't do this as a city on our own; we need to continue to ask for funding from both the federal and provincial governments.

7. Nutrition-related diseases (e.g., diabetes, heart disease, certain cancers) cost London and Ontario millions of dollars annually. Low income residents can't afford to eat a healthy diet, once housing and other essential bills are paid. What do you think London City Council could do to increase access to and availability of healthy foods?

This is a tough question. One method maybe to allow for greater use of city property for urban farming. London is 40% class one agricultural land and some of this land may be used. Secondly in our future planning initiatives we think can consider making healthy food related choices accessible via foot or public transit. Let's imagine a fresh affordable food market at a transit hub for instance.
