

HEALTHY PREGNANCY AND HEALTHY GROWTH AND DEVELOPMENT

What do we know about people giving birth in our region and the risk factors faced by their children.

In recent years, among the residents of Middlesex-London there have been about 5,000 live births each year. Over the past 10 years, our live birth rate and pregnancy rates have dropped and the average age of the birthing parent has increased.







These downward trends are all in line with the rest of Ontario.



ACEs Impact the Health and Well-being of our Children

Adverse Childhood Events (ACEs) are risk factors that are known to have long-term impacts on the health and well-being of children. The Healthy Babies Healthy Children Screening Tool asks new parents in Ontario about various ACEs-like risk factors that may impact healthy child development.

Our Response:

Middlesex-London Health Unit supports healthy child development by:

- Providing programs for pregnant individuals and families with young children, including:
 - Smart Start for Babies: Free weekly prenatal nutrition program for low-income pregnant individuals.
 - Breastfeeding Supports: Phone or in-person help for families facing breastfeeding challenges.
 - Healthy Babies, Healthy Children: Nurse home visits for qualifying families from pregnancy to school entry.
 - Nurse-Family Partnership: Nurse home visits for first-time parents under 24 facing life challenges.
- Collaborating with partners in the Age Friendly London and Child and Youth Network to improve child and youth well-being.
- Providing health information to licensed childcare providers and early childhood educators through targeted outreach.
