




Respiratory Virus Activity November 5, 2023 – November 11, 2023












Influenza Vaccine

- As of October 30th, 2023, available to:
 - All individuals six months of age and older
- Individuals 65 years of age and older:
 - All vaccines protect against the flu. Do NOT delay vaccination to wait for a certain product.

Fluad® – Trivalent-Adjuvanted Inactivated Vaccine (TIV-Adj)

Fluzone® - Standard Dose Quadrivalent Inactivated vaccine (QIV)



COVID-19 Vaccine

- As of October 30th, 2023, available to:
 - All individuals six months of age and older
- Vaccines available to order from the Health Unit:

Vaccine	Available to Individuals Ages:
Moderna Spikevax® (Omicron XBB.1.5 subvariant) and Infant Pfizer -BioNTech Comirnaty® (Omicron XBB.1.5 subvariant)	6 months – 4 years (Moderna is preferred product for this age group for those previously unvaccinated)
Pediatric Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty® (Omicron XBB.1.5 subvariant)	5 years - 11 years
Pfizer-BioNTech Comirnaty® (Omicron XBB.1.5 subvariant)	12 years and older

Breastfeeding is Important

- Breastfeeding, exclusively for the first six months and continued up to two years and beyond, is recommended for healthy term infants as the optimal feeding method (Health Canada, 2012)
- Breastfeeding is important
 - nutritional and immunological benefits to baby,
 - reduced risk of chronic disease;
 - ensures food security for families;
 - supports infant mental health and secure attachment;
 - and more...



Current Context in Middlesex-London

- Prenatal intention to breastfeed:
 - Any breastfeeding remains high at over 90%
 - Exclusive breastfeeding has started to decline in past couple of years
- Breastfeeding at hospital discharge:
 - Any breastfeeding remains high at over 90%
 - Exclusive breastfeeding at hospital discharge has taken a down-turn from over 60% to closer to 44.7%
- Lowest rate in 10 years; trending lower since pandemic

(BORN Information System; Middlesex-London Infant Feeding Surveillance System)



Priorities Moving Forward

- Breastfeeding initiation and duration rates increase with active protection, support, and promotion (Health Canada, 2012)
- Implement the policies and practices of the Baby-Friendly Initiative for hospitals and community health services (Health Canada, 2012; Registered Nurses Association of Ontario, 2018; Canadian Pediatric Society, 2022)
 - ➤ Ten Steps to Successful Breastfeeding (World Health Organization & UNICEF, 2018; Breastfeeding Committee for Canada, 2021)



Key Clinical Practices

- Prenatal education
- Skin-to-skin contact at birth and ongoing
- Support breastfeeding initiation and maintenance
- Mother-infant togetherness
- Responsive, cue-based feeding
- Informed decisions around use of bottles and pacifiers
- Ensure support



What We Can Do

- Patient Health Teaching based on three key messages:
 - Prepare for baby's arrival
 - Help breastfeeding get off to a good start
 - Know where to go for support (prenatal and postpartum)



Prepare for Baby's Arrival

Learn why breastfeeding is important

Learn how breastfeeding works and about normal newborn behaviour



Key Message #2: Help Breastfeeding get off to a Good Start

- Feed as soon as possible after birth
- Provide early skin-to-skin contact
- Feed frequently
- Keep your baby close (share a room together)
- Learn hand expression (give breastmilk if supplements are needed)

- Cost of feeding infants with a diagnosis requiring strict avoidance of soy and milk proteins is a significant challenge for many families.
- If these children receive supplementation, they require hypoallergic formula.
- Call to Action: ODB Program Amendments to Support Infants and Children with a Medical Diagnosis* Requiring Strict Avoidance of Standard Soy and Milk Proteins.
