Breastfeeding

- Breastfeeding promotion and support is an important public health activity
 - Provides optimal nutrition
 - Many benefits to mother, baby, family, and community
 - Risks of not breastfeeding
 - Local data indicates high initiation rate but numbers drop significantly after first few months







Ministry of Health and Long Term Care

- Baby-Friendly Initiative designation is the Accountability Indicator for the Family Health Standards
- Requirements have been set out by the Ministry (preliminary, intermediate*, advanced)

The Baby-Friendly Initiative

- A global, evidence based strategy that supports best practices for improving infant and child health and development through the promotion, protection and support of breastfeeding
- Consists of 'The 10 Steps to Successful Breastfeeding' & 'The WHO Code of Marketing of Breast Milk Substitutes'





Requirements

Baby-Friendly Initiative:

 Step 1 – Create a breastfeeding policy and communicate it routinely to all staff/volunteers.
Post a policy summary & make available in areas where families receive service.

Ministry:

- Develop a written BFI policy
- Have the Board endorse the policy
- Provide a policy orientation to the Board choose
