

Ontario Publicly Funded Immunization Schedule Human Papilloma Virus (HPV) (Updated in June 2019)

MALES (by year of birth)	Eligibility for HPV-9	
Born before 2004	NOT ELIGIBLE (unless high-risk, see below)	
Born within 2004	This group was previously eligible for HPV4 when in grade 7. Now eligible for HPV-9 if finishing up an incomplete series started with HPV-4, or starting a new series. Not eligible once graduated from high school. Not eligible to have any HPV-9 doses if HPV-4 series is already complete.	
Born 2005 or later	Eligible for the full series beginning in grade 7 and/or until the client graduates high school.	

FEMALES (by year of birth)	Eligibility for HPV-9
Born within or before 2004	This group was previously eligible for HPV4 when in grade 7. Now eligible for HPV-9 if finishing up an incomplete series started with HPV-4, or starting a new series Not eligible once graduated from high school. Not eligible to have any HPV-9 doses if HPV-4 series is already complete.
Born 2005 or later	Eligible for the full series beginning in grade 7 and/or until the client graduates high school.

HIGH RISK MALES	Eligibility for HPV-9
Men who have sex with men who are 26 years of age or younger	This group was previously eligible for HPV4. Now eligible for HPV9 if finishing up an incomplete series started with HPV4, or starting a new series. Not eligible to have HPV9 doses if HPV4 series is complete.

AGE AT FIRST DOSE	RECOMMENDED SCHEDULE
Healthy Males & Females 9-14 years old	2 doses
	(0, 6 months)
Immunocompromised Males & Females 9-14 years old	3 doses
	(0, 2 and 6 months)
Females 15-45 years old	3 doses
(Can purchase and receive vaccine at a pharmacy if not	(0, 2 and 6 months)
eligible through publicly funded criteria, as noted above)	
Males 15-26 years old	3 doses
(Can purchase and receive vaccine at a pharmacy if not	(0, 2 and 6 months)
eligible through publicly funded criteria, as noted above)	

- Number of doses required depends on the client's age at <u>first</u> dose.
- If the interval between doses exceeds recommended spacing, continue with schedule above depending on age of first dose and do not repeat previous dose(s).
- Any series started with HPV4 can be completed with HPV9. No repeat or extra doses are required to complete series.
- DO NOT use publicly funded HPV-9 vaccine for individuals who do not qualify for it.
